As we reflect on the past year at the Boys & Girls Club of Burbank and Greater East Valley, we are filled with immense gratitude for the unwavering support we have received from our incredible community. Your commitment has been instrumental in providing a world-class Club experience that assures success is within reach of every young person who walks through our doors.

What a year it has been for our organization! We are pleased to share some highlights of the tremendous success and growth we have experienced.

- In March, we hosted another successful Career fair where a panel of business professionals from companies like WET Design, Burbank Police and Fire, Hasbro, Providence St. Joseph, Cast & Crew and Bank of America discussed their career paths and spent time with over 100 teens discussing workforce readiness.
- In May, we proudly hosted the Annual STEAM Fest, a celebration of innovation, education and community engagement. The festival showcased our VEX Robotics program and a visual and performing arts showcase where over 80 club members performed and exhibited their own movie making skills and visual arts.
- In August, we hosted a retreat for the freshman class of Providence High School. This continued us on our path of sharing our facility with the city, service clubs and non-profits to foster collaboration and a strong sense of community.
- In December, we hosted the Sierra Madre Chapter of Boys & Girls Club of America's Professional Association where Boys & Girls Club employees from all over Los Angeles visited our Club and spent the day training and sharing best practices for successful youth development.
- And throughout the year, we have created a space that goes beyond our immediate mission. From free basketball clinics, to non-profit acting troupes, craft fairs, parent workshops, service club meeting spots, free clothing and food giveaways, our facility has become a hub where local groups come together, share resources and support one another.

Finally, we were also able to expand our geographic reach and opened two new locations in partnership with LAUSD at Lanai Road Elementary and Academy for Enriched Sciences, both in Encino, CA. This brings our total sites to 27 locations serving over 3,500 youth.

A heartfelt thank you to our hardworking staff, board members, community supporters and donors for your belief in our organization and the work we do. Your support has been a driving force behind our success and we are sincerely grateful for your commitment to creating a brighter future for the youth in our community.

We look forward to what 2024 will bring.

We see a great future for you, Eisley! So happy you are here.



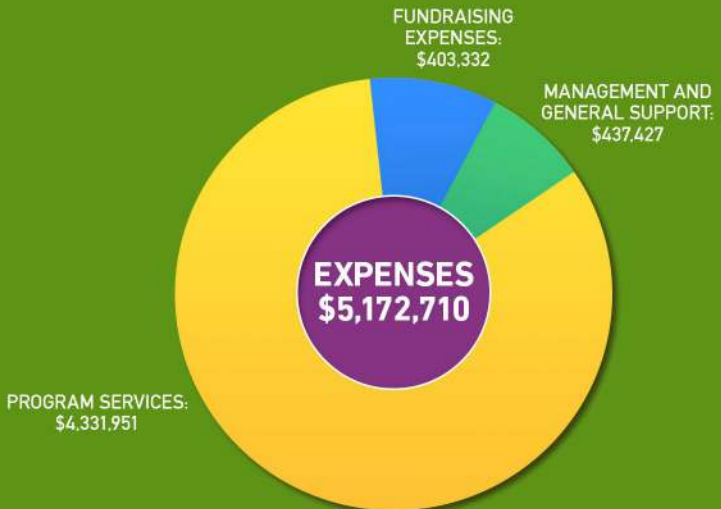
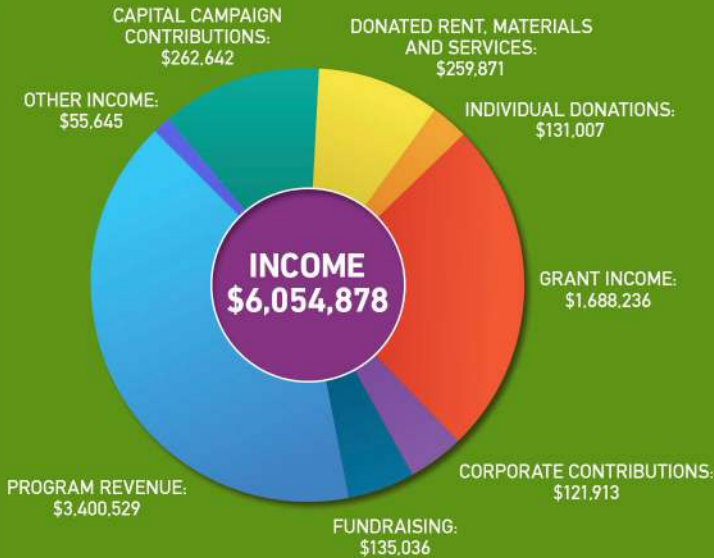
Evan is 11 years old and has been a Washington Elementary School site member for 2 years. He is in 4th grade.
