2025-2026 ANNUAL REPORT

Dear Friends,

The year 2025 was one of the most challenging our community has faced, as the Palisades and Eaton Fires devastated families, homes, and neighborhoods. During this time of crisis, we are deeply grateful that our organization was able to serve as a central hub for relief, providing clothing, essentials, and critical resources to those in need.

We extend our sincere thanks to Warner Bros. Discovery, The Walt Disney Company, Old Navy, Dove, Target, and EcoSet, for their extraordinary generosity. Their continued support ensured a steady supply of items our families, members, and the broader community relied on throughout the year. Even through December 2025, we remained actively engaged in fire relief efforts, sharing personal care items, clothing, and food with fellow nonprofits and affected communities.

Throughout this period, our sites stayed open as safe and welcoming spaces for families where children could find stability and care while parents navigated the personal tragedy of homes damaged or lost. Despite these challenges, we continued to grow. We proudly opened new sites at St. Cyril in Encino and Chandler Elementary in Sherman Oaks, bringing our total footprint to 34 locations serving 6,100 kids a day. Our partnerships with the Archdiocese, LAUSD and Burbank Unified School District remain strong and vital to this expansion.

All while this was happening, some good news arrived in 2025 as we celebrated a wonderful milestone, our 30th anniversary, marking three decades of serving the Greater San Fernando Valley and parts of Los Angeles. That same year, we were honored to be selected as a Panda Cares Center of Hope, further expanding our reach and impact. In addition, we continued to share our facility with fellow nonprofits, church services, and community organizations, reinforcing our commitment to collaboration and service.

Supporting the community is at the core of everything we do. Thank you to everyone who stands behind our mission. Your generosity and commitment are the driving forces behind our success, and we are profoundly grateful for your continued support as we carry this work forward.


