CHILD CARE FOR ESSENTIAL & LOW-INCOME WORKERS

PROGRAM

The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors and the City of Los Angeles have dedicated part of their CARES Act funding to provide child care services (vouchers) for essential workers and low-income working parents during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Child Care Alliance of Los Angeles (CCALA) and its partner agencies will distribute these funds to eligible essential workers.

ELIGIBILITY

Eligible families must be:


- Essential workers or low-income working families (essential worker includes: parents/guardians working in essential services such as, the health care industry, emergency services, food and agriculture, and other businesses currently open as per the Governor's most recent guidelines)
- Must live in Los Angeles County
- Need child care to perform their essential work
- Is not able to work remotely
- Meet certain income eligibility
- If the family includes a two-parent household, both parents must either be essential workers or the other parent must be unable to provide care for the child due to incapacitation


TIMELINE

Families who meet eligibility guidelines may receive emergency child care services for their children until December 30, 2020.

CUIDADO INFANTIL PARA TRABAJADORES ESENCIALES Y DE BAJOS INGRESOS

PROGRAMA

La Junta de Supervisores del Condado de Los Angeles y la Ciudad de Los Angeles han dedicado parte de sus fondos de la ley CARES para brindar servicios de cuidado infantil (subsídios) para trabajadores esenciales y padres trabajadores de bajos ingresos durante la pandemia de COVID-19. Child Care Alliance of Los Angeles (CCALA) y sus agencias asociadas distribuirán estos fondos a los trabajadores esenciales elegibles.

ELIGIBILIDAD

Las familias elegibles deben ser:


- Trabajadores esenciales o familias trabajadoras de bajos ingresos (el trabajador esencial incluye: padres / tutor legal que trabajan en servicios esenciales como la industria del cuidado de la salud, servicios de emergencia, alimentos y agricultura y otros negocios actualmente abiertos según las pautas más recientes del Gobernador)
- Debe vivir en el condado de Los Angeles
- Necesitan cuidado infantil para realizar su trabajo esencial
- No puede trabajar de forma remota
- Cumplir con ciertos requisitos de ingresos
- Si la familia incluye un hogar de dos padres, ambos padres deben ser trabajadores esenciales o el otro padre debe ser incapaz de cuidar al niño debido a una incapacitación.

DISPONIBILIDAD

Las familias que cumplen con los requisitos de elegibilidad pueden recibir servicios de cuidado infantil de emergencia para sus hijos hasta el 30 de diciembre de 2020.
