What is telehealth?

WCU's telehealth program provides nursing students the opportunity to learn while giving back to the community. Since telehealth is conducted over the phone, it is a great way for community members to learn about health concerns without having to visit a doctor's office.

What kind of health issues can telehealth support?

A telehealth appointment can provide you healthcare education in a variety of topics, including:

- COVID-19

- Medication Administration
- Senior Health

What should I expect on a telehealth call?

Initially, you will be contacted to schedule a time for a telehealth appointment. During your appointment, a WCU nursing professor and students will contact you by phone to discuss any health concerns you might want to learn about. They might ask if they can schedule a follow-up appointment to share additional resources.

What are the benefits?

Connect with nursing professionals and students to get better educated about your health, including learning more about COVID-19 safety.
