After more than a decade of looking for a new facility, the perfect opportunity presented itself at the most unlikely time.

In late 2020, the former Salvation Army building became available and on a lark, we investigated the space to see if it would fit our needs. To our great surprise it did. Now, more than a year later, we are home. For the first time we have ample program space, administrative space and parking! In addition, we have a beautiful courtyard, gymnasium and performing arts center. The best part is that we have been able to share our beautiful new space with other organizations in the community. The Kids That Make The Club

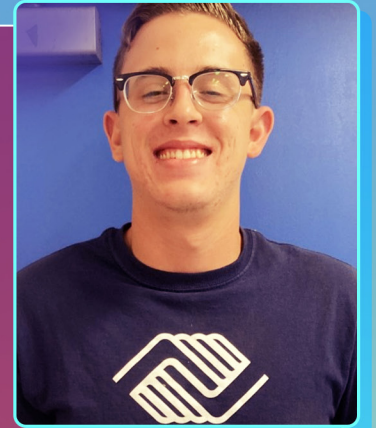
At the Boys & Girls Club, we see the potential in every child and teen, and are here to help them fulfill their potential and become who they are meant to be.

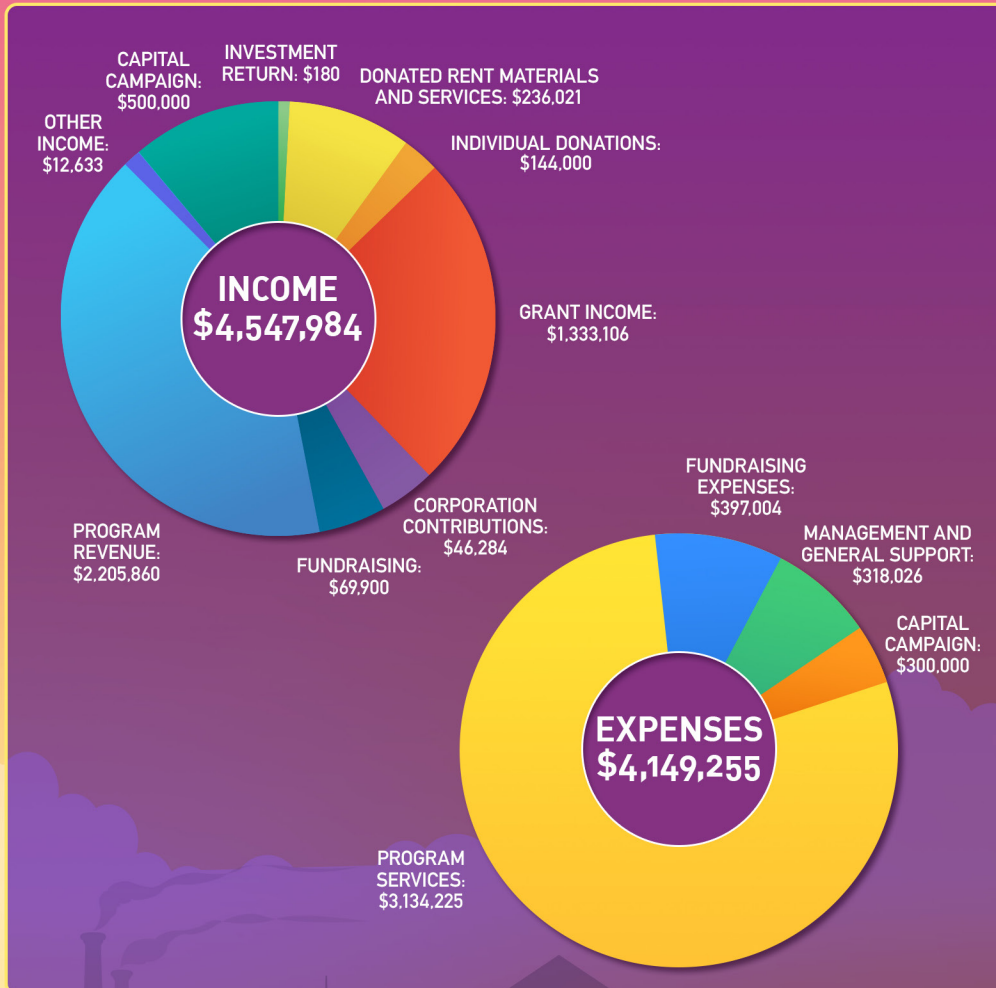
